

MASON CITY EXPANDING WITH Development Opportunities

The City of Mason City worked with several new developments and expansions over the last few months including a new 50,000 square foot distribution facility in the industrial park, an expansion of Stellar Manufacturing into an adjacent warehouse facility, and the expansion at Curries Manufacturing. These three projects combined will add over 100 new jobs to our community! Additionally, several new commercial developments are in progress or recently completed including Chik-fil-A, Ulta Beauty, Ross, Five Below, and Old Navy. Developments like these are an indicator of our strong local economy, and the city is diligently working to seize future development opportunities.

One example of this work to prepare the community for new development is the \$1 million Community Project Funding grant Mason City recently received for expansion of water infrastructure in the industrial park. The expansion of water and wastewater utilities in the industrial park is critical to the continued development of this area and the recruitment of new industry. Many prospective businesses interested in the industrial park require abundant water utilities as part of their processes. Several studies were completed to layout the plan for this expansion and construction will be completed over the next few years. Due to these planning and development efforts, the city has already succeeded in the announcement of the New Energy Blue project and is working to recruit several other projects in this area.

The strength of Mason City's commercial and industrial sectors employs a vibrant workforce and provides funding to support everything from our school district to public safety. Local Option Sales and Service Taxes and Property Taxes collected through these businesses allow for the community to continue to develop important quality of life amenities like the city park and trail system. With a strong presence in manufacturing and renewable fuels and expanding commercial sector, Mason City is well positioned to grow into the future!

Please be advised that the Mason City Fire Department is currently closed to the public due to ongoing construction. We apologize for any inconvenience this may cause.

During this time, ambulance payments can be mailed or dropped off at City Hall (10 1st St NW- Mason City). For those preferring to make payments by phone, please call 1-641-421-3615.

Additionally, please note that our battery drop box will not be available, but you can still recycle your household batteries at these alternative locations: Brothers Ace Hardware, Overhead Door Company of Mason City, and the Landfill of North Iowa. Kindly contact them directly for drop-off locations.

SPRING HAS SPRUNG AND IT'S TIME FOR SOME SPRING CLEANING!

*Yard waste collection season has begun and residents are responsible for properly maintaining leaves and branches on your property. Please do not blow leaves into the street as they often end up in the stormwater drain, causing the potential for water back-up into homes and flooding of the streets. Set out your yard waste and all sanitation items on your specified collection day by 7 am.

*Need to get rid of **large items**? We've got you covered! No need to wait for a specific week - the City picks up large items year round! Simply call the Sanitation Division to schedule a large item pick-up. Sanitation stickers are required to be attached to all large items and staff is available to assist you with the number of stickers for each of the items or review the list at www.masoncity.net and click on the 'Sanitation' tab under the Departments header. Schedule your pick-up by calling Sanitation at 641-421-3691.

33/50 – 33 gallon limit bag and 50 pound maximum weight.

Don't overstuff your garbage bags and keep your refuse at a 33 gallon limit that weighs no more than 50 pounds. Let's all help keep Mason City beautiful!

Do you have a green thumb? Do you want to try your hand at planting but don't have the space? **We have space just for you!** All locations have water access.

The gardening season begins in the spring and plots must be cleared by October 15th.

Plots are rentable per season and come in sizes of 20' x 20' for \$40 and 20' x 40' for \$60.

New applications will be accepted starting Monday, **April 17, 2024** and may be dropped off at the Mason City Parks and Recreation office (in the mall), 100 S. Federal Ave. Suite 201, Monday - Friday 8 am - 4 pm. Cash, check, credit or debit card payments accepted.


