In an effort to keep the cemetery grounds clean and safe, we have adjusted the decoration guidelines. Each plot with a burial can include one permanent vase, one eternal (permanent) light, and one American flag. Recent burials can have decorations a the gravesite for up to 30 days after burial, and additional decorations are allowed for both Memorial Day and Winter/Christmas seasons.

# **'MASON CITY ARENA' NAMED** the Recipient of the 2020 Best Development Award in the Renovated Civic category by 1000 Friends of Iowa

1000 Friends of lowa presented the Mason City Arena project with the 2020 Best Development Award in the Renovated Civic category at its virtual awards ceremony in January. The Arena was selected for converting a vacant shopping mall space into an ice skating arena to fit the recreational needs of the community with many positive trickle-down effects.

The Best Development Award Program recognizes projects in up to 12 different categories as a way for 1000 Friends of Iowa to express the fact that smart land use and sustainable communities are more than constructed buildings. All of the award recipients help advance sustainability across our state by considering site design, outdoor and indoor environmental impact, community and public use, and long-term benefits.

"The recognition of the Mason City Arena by 1000 Friends of Iowa is truly special because the award embodies the focus of the River City Renaissance," said City Administrator Aaron Burnett." This development effort is pushing new density into Mason City's downtown and creating an attractive walkable area with numerous entertainment and dining options close to newly renovated and newly constructed downtown housing options. The Mason City Arena is transformative for the heart of our community and

is bringing new life to once vacant and abandoned buildings. The community's progressive steps towards sustainable development will continue to drive momentum for many years to come."

This year's recipients were chosen because they implemented the efficient use of resources to develop sustainable communities and provide a high quality of life.

# **KEEP YOUR PETS SAFE** Make Sure They are Licensed

Pet owners in Mason City should ensure any dog and/or cat over the age of 6 months is licensed with the City Clerk's office. Licensing provides pets with needed identification and residents with the peace of mind that an animal is properly vaccinated and has an owner. Animals without tags are considered stray and are at risk of being stolen or unidentifiable in the instance of an accident. Keeping your pet's license current and attached to their collar provides them with a greater chance of a safe return home in the instance they become lost.

Proof of the rabies vaccination and proof of the spay/neuter of your pet must be presented prior to obtaining a license. City licenses may be renewed for 1.2 or 3 years dependent on the expiration of the rabies vaccinations. License fees shall be \$50 per year for each animal that has not been altered and \$10 per year for each neutered or spayed pet.

# **MONROE AVENUE REHABILITATION PROJECT**

Monroe Avenue will be undergoing major improvements this year. The project limits begin at 5th Street SW and extend to 12th Street NW. The contractors will first begin working on the underground utilities which include water, sanitary and storm sewer. After the underground work is complete, the street will receive a new Hot Mix Asphalt surface. In addition to the street surface will be the reconstruction of the pedestrian ramps at the intersection crossings.



The Monroe Avenue project is being funded through numerous sources including a Surface Transportation Block Grant (STBG) in the amount of one-million dollars. The remaining funding will be by the city through Road Use Tax, Water and Sewer funds.

The bids for the project were received on March 16th, and construction is planned to begin in late April. The street project will extend throughout the entire summer, but will be phased to help reduce traffic disruptions. The public is advised to avoid traveling near the construction area when possible to ensure not only the safety of themselves but to those working on the project.

### **ASON CITY ENGINEERIN ROJECTS FOR 2021**

Several other projects have been planned and are set to move forward this construction season. The following are just a few city-wide projects that you may encounter as you travel about.

### **2021 STREET REHABILITATION PROGRAM**

 The project involves upgrades and replacement of water and sewer fixtures, pedestrian ramps at street crossings and a new Hot Mix Asphalt surface.

### STREET PANEL AND CURB REPLACEMENT

• The project involves the replacement of small pavement patches and the replacement of damaged or missing street curbing.

### PAVEMENT TRAFFIC MARKINGS

 The project involves the application of marking paint to restore existing traffic and pedestrian related symbols and line work.



YIELD group members met with city staff to address concerns and evaluate the status of the repairs and replacements to the equipment. They solicited donations to cover project expenses and thanks to generous contributions by more than 40 businesses and community members, new equipment including an accessible swing and a sand digger will be installed. Several repairs and replacements will also be made including the sound wall chimes, new mallets for the xylophone, fiber cables to replace chains, new end cap for a broken slide, and windows for the tunnels. In addition to the repairs, the current wood mulch will be replaced with engineered wood mulch – an ADA approved fall surface – making play safer for children. The entire structure will also receive a facelift with a fresh coat of stain.

While plans are in place, there is still a lot of heavy lifting to be done. The old adage "many hands make light work" is certainly the case with this large-scale project. Students are soliciting volunteers to assist with renovations in early May. Individuals or businesses interested in helping with the project by spreading mulch or staining the wooden structure can contact Allyson at the Chamber (akrull@masoncitvia.com).
