

A ribbon cutting was held in October, opening the south portion of the High Line Trail 'Linking Our Community'. This off-street trail system runs through the heart of the community from 19th Street SE to just north of 13th Street NE. Formerly an overgrown and unsightly abandoned Union Pacific rail line unused for over 30 years, this beautifully repurposed greenway corridor provides a unique opportunity for pedestrians and bicyclists to access local and regional trail systems.

Plans are underway to break ground for the first phase of the Bike North Iowa Project. This particular phase of the project includes numerous mountain bike trail areas nearing completion in the design process. This trail system will create amenities to serve users of all skill levels while creating a quality experience for residents and visitors based on their individual comfort level. This **Bike Park** and pump track will provide access to previously closed off scenic nature areas in Mason City, located just north of the Dog Park on 13th Street NE. Construction of the first phase is expected to begin in the spring of 2024 and finish by fall of 2024.

The overall Destination lowa Project includes several phases to enhance the recreational experience and contribute to the quality of life in Mason City. Project segments currently in the design process include additional single-track mountain biking trails throughout the community, shelter and trail facilities, bouldering equipment, Murphy Park trail and bridge, downtown Riverwalk, and so much more. We're going to be busy in 2024!

These projects enhance our many abundant leisure opportunities adding to Mason City's growing reputation as a recreational destination!



MASON CITY RESIDENTIAL SANITATION PROGRAM UPDATES

The City has partnered with Absolute Waste Removal, Inc. for the processing and marketing of recyclables collected by the City of Mason City. You may be asking, 'what does this mean for me and how does this affect me?' This agreement does not change how your recyclables are collected. The City's Sanitation staff will continue to collect the items on your normal sanitation service day and use the same recycling container that you were previously provided. City staff will haul the recyclables to a facility to be processed.

Here are the general quidelines for what you can recycle and what shouldn't be recycled.



TO STAY PREPARED

A look at the future lobby of the new Mason City Municipal Airport terminal building

With winter upon us, there are a few reminders to ensure you are prepared for the season of snow and cold.

*The City's Alternate Side Parking Ordinance (ASP) will be put in effect when the forecast calls for 2" or more of snow. While ASP is in effect, vehicles need to be parked on the odd numbered side of the street on odd numbered days and the even numbered side of the street on even numbered days. The 'grace period' time to move your vehicle from one side to the other is between 4-7 pm the evening before.

Keep in the know about when the ASP is in effect. The City provides several ways to notify residents of the status.

*It is the responsibility of property owners to ensure sidewalks are cleared of snow/ice within 48 hours after the end of a snowfall. Per City Code, if the snow/ice is not cleared at that time, the City will remove the snow for a fee to be assessed to the property owner. Be a good neighbor!

Notes of INTEREST

-The City's curbside yard waste collection season is scheduled to resume on Monday, April 1, 2023, weather permitting. Christmas tree collection is tentatively scheduled for Wednesday, January 10, 2023. Trees should be placed at the curbside prior to 7:00 am on that day and if the tree is over 6 feet tall, cut it in half before placing on curb. Tree stands, nails or metal fasteners, wire, tinsel, and plastic bags must be removed from the tree. Roping or wreaths that contain wire must be placed in regular garbage.

The Friends of the Library Geranium plant sale will be held Friday and Saturday, May 3 and 4, 2024. Pre-orders for geraniums are available from the Friends of the Library beginning in January and continuing through March. Order forms are available at the Public Library located at 225 2nd Street SE.
